The OSA sponsored a Rapid Response Team from Mercy Medical Center to attend advanced training in Chaos Management at the University of Pittsburgh WISER Center. Starting fall 2007, the team is anxious to share what they learned by offering a course at Mercy Medical Center Nursing Resource Center, Roseburg, OR.

The objective of this course is to prepare the trainee for early intervention in a crisis situation. To provide the best patient care the focus will be on early intervention. Team training, communication, judgment and planning will be utilized to accomplish this goal. Role playing and simulation will be incorporated to add realism to the situations.
