- Step 2: Through the event app or your desktop, visit the survey magnate website (through a link OHCA provides), ENTER the CEU code and EVALUATE each session you attended.
- Step 3: Once you've completed the steps for each session you attend, DOWNLOAD AND PRINT your CEU form!

While we recommend you download the event app to make tracking easier, you do not need to have access to the app to use this program. It can easily be accessed on your desktop computer. OHCA will have computers available at the event to show you how to use this program.
